RECORDING WITH GEORGE LEVER

PRE-RECORDING PREPARATION:

Before recording either with me there is a short list of requirements that should be completed before we start working together on your project.

THEY ARE AS FOLLOWS:

New strings on any guitars and basses that you wish to use.

For the guitars and basses to be set up by a professional technician (Tuning, intonation and truss rod adjustment.)

Ensure that your material is well rehearsed and everyone knows their parts clearly and comprehensively.

Vocalists are to not leave writing lyrics to the last minute with in the studio.

Half of the agreed amount is to be paid as a deposit before any work takes place.

Demos – pre productions of every song you may wish to record with myself.

Demos are important. If you want to have a high polished product, it will help to have a demo of all the songs in question.

With a demo, I can instantly hear the main idea of the song and visualize what will need to be done. Without a demo, I am putting your record together in the dark, with a blindfold on. This holds true for projects that I produce as well. Hearing your demo will enable me to discover what is there, what is missing, and a lot of other stuff that speeds up the process of creating a record.

Refusing to listen to this advice will effect the final production.

WHEN RECORDING WITH ME:

When recording with me there are a few rules that should be respected and followed to ensure a perfect environment is kept for recording.

These are;

No food in the room while recording.

All drinks are to be in bottles with screw or sport top lids to make sure nothing can be spilled on equipment.

No other music to be played. (Only time when other music is to be played would be for reference purposes.)

No smoking within the studio

No drug taking on the premises .

Musicians must be completely sober (not even hungover) for recording.

Note: Session hours are between 8-10 hours a day. The start time can vary based on whatever schedule I am on. The indicated time for recording includes a lunch and dinner break of 30 - 60 minutes each.
